Setting your priorities

Academic

- ► Which institutions have the most prestige in your field?
- Are you ready to start working on your own research project?

Would you prefer to attend courses and learn instead?

► What is your motivation for going on this research or study trip? Which destination will benefit you the most in this regard?

Location

- ► Which country will you go to? Identify your most important criteria: Safety? Living expenses? Does your destination need to be in an English-speaking country?
- A large city, small town, or village? Pros and cons?


Where to start: Type B2



Search online in English with keywords for your area of study, etc.



Make sure to check the original source (each program's own website) for up-to-date information



Check for information on the website of a university or research institution that you are interested in



Apply to that program

You may have lots of concerns



TYPE B1/B2

- ►Where can I find a good internship / summer school?
- ► Will my schedule conflict with a summer school or internship program?



TYPE A

- ► How am I going to identify a professor or researcher abroad?
- ► How am I going to contact him or her?
- ► Is my email polite enough?
- ► Will he or she reply? If not, what to do next?



Don't worry!

ALL TYPES

How much will it cost me to participate in the SVAP program? Will the overall expenses be more than SVAP can cover?

What next

- ▶DECIDE on TYPE A, TYPE B1, or TYPE B2
- CONTACT a professor or START APPLYING for existing programs (deadlines!)
- APPLY TO SVAP 2025:

By February 16th (Monday) at noon (12:00 sharp)

- ▶ RESULTS: Mid- to late March
- ►ONCE SELECTED: Prepare for departure in consultation with the Intl Team
 - ► Admission procedure, if any
 - ►Visa → you should already start checking the host institution's visa rules
 - ►Housing → look for a safe place (don't book/pay yet)
 - ►Insurance, etc. → some visas/universities/countries require a more complex type of insurance (e.g. J1 visa (coverage of pre-existing conditions after a reasonable waiting period))
